

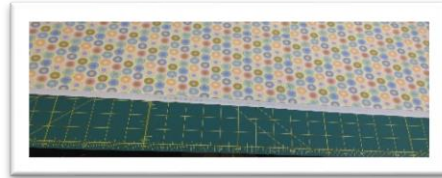
How to fold fabric using a Quilt Fabric Organizer board.

I prefer to fold my fabric using a table surface, but I have folded hundreds without any table at all. Using a table helps to keep fabric tight and straight, so this tutorial uses a table surface.

1. Take fabric and unfold.



2. Measure fabric (If you want to know the amount before rolling.)



3. Write fabric amount on board with a marker that will NOT bleed into fabric. (Optional)



4. Take fabric and smooth out. Fold in half, lining up selvage edge to fold.



5. Begin wrapping fabric around board, keeping a little tension so the fabric rolls tight.



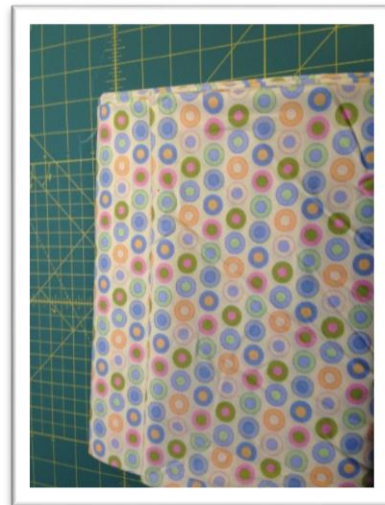
6. Stop and readjust as needed to keep folds together.



7. Keep rolling and repositioning. (I find that it is easier to wrap the fabric if I roll the board, leaving the fabric stationary until I get to the edge of the table, then pull back across the table, straighten the fabric, then start rolling again.)



8. When near the end, tuck end under before rolling up the last few inches.



9. Use a fastener (I prefer coated paperclips) to hold fabric together.
